## **ITINERARY**

**Friday, October 18:** Departure on airline of your choice.

#### Day 1-2: Saturday-Sunday, October 19-20:



Tour begins. Arrive in <u>Athens</u>. "The gods could have lived anywhere: They chose Greece." Transfer to our hotel. Welcome dinner. Explore ancient and modern city of Athens; visit the <u>Royal Palace</u>, <u>Temple of Olympian Zeus</u>, <u>Acropolis</u>, and <u>Omonia Square</u>. Greek folk dancing with Maria's local folk dance group See <u>(dancing Hasapico in Maria's</u>

<u>class</u>): See video. Overnight Parthenon hotel in Athens.



Drive to <u>Cape Sounio</u>, known for its <u>Temple of Poseidon</u>, one of the major monuments of the <u>Golden Age of Athens</u>. Its remains are perched on the headland, surrounded on three sides by the <u>Aegean sea</u>. Wine tasting in Spata. Overnight Parthenon in Athens.

#### **FIVE DAY CLASSICAL TOUR**

Day 4: Tuesday, October 22:



See <u>Corinthian canal.</u> Visit archaeological site of <u>Mycenae.</u> Legend has it that the name was connected to the Greek mykēs ( $\mu$ úκης, "mushroom"). theater at <u>Epidaurus.</u> Dinner. **Folk dancing with Niko's group** Overnight at Hotel Liberty in Nauplion .



#### Day 5: Wednesday, October 23:

Visit <u>Palamidi castle</u>. Ouzo tasting in Karonis. Visit a farm for the orange harvest. Walking tour of <u>Nauplia</u>, a <u>Peloponnesian coastal city</u>, <u>capital of the regional unit of Argolis</u>. Founded in antiquity, the city became an important seaport in the Middle Ages. Overnight at Hotel Liberty in Nauplion.

#### Day 6: Thursday, October 24:

Depart for Olympia. Drive through central Peloponnese passing Megalopolis and Tripolis. The Peleponnesian city of Kalamata where the Syrtos, the national dance of Greece, (Kalamatianos) originated. (Along with Kalamate olives, (See youtube video) Visit the Museum and archeological site of Olympia, birthplace of the Olympic Games. Dinner, folk dancing (see video). Overnight at Hotel Olympian Asty in Olympia.



Day 7: Friday, October 25:

Depart for Delphi. Drive through Nafpakto. 100 year old Yiayia dances Tsamiko on Easter

Sunday in Nafpaktos. Visit Delphi museum and archeological site.

Dinner, folk dancing, and overnight Hotel Amalia in Delphi.



### Day 8: Saturday, October 26:

Drive through **Arachova**, **Lamia**, **and Trikala**. Arrive in <u>Kalambaka</u>. Home of Karagouna (see video) and the Karagonides Festival. Visit two of the most famous <u>Meteora monasteries</u>. Dinner, **folk dancing**. Overnight in Hotel Grand Meteora in Kastraki.



Day 9-11: Sunday, October 27-Tuesday, October 29:

Depart for Thessaloniki. Ochi day celebrations, parade, and more! Visit ancient Aigai, capital of the Macedonian kings. In 1977 the professor Manolis Andronikos uncovered four royal tombs in Vergina. The studies indicated that the largest of the tombs belonged to Philip II, the father of Alexander the Great. The underground museum contains the graves and all the valuable grave offerings, including the famous golden larnax of Philip with the star of Vergina. City tour of Thessalonika. (Northern Greece, home of the hora Zondaritikos: see videos). We'll visit castle, Modiano Market, and archeological museum. White tower and Church of Agios Dimitrios.

The **Ochi day** is one of the two national holidays in Greece and it is celebrated everywhere in our country with school parades. But in Thessaloniki it is really unique. Here's why: Greece





was liberated from the Ottomans in 1830, but northern Greece remained under the Turks until 1912 (Balkan wars). The city was liberated on the 26th of October, the feast day of saint Dimitri is, the patron saint of the city. So, as you understand it is a double celebration for the people. It's the ceremonial Celebration in the big church and after the service, the impressive military parade. The main road leading to the White Tower was renamed to "leoforos Nikis" Niki means Victory. It was renamed by the king George I, who entered the city. It's really unique and impressive. The celebration lasts 3 days, with parade on the 28th. Dinner and overnight in Hotel Classical Imperial Palace.
